Psalm 102:25-27

"Knowing Your Father - God is Unchanging"

I. The Bible teaches us that God is unchanging.

25 Of old You laid the foundation of the earth, And the heavens [are] the work of Your hands. 26 They will perish, but You will endure; Yes, they will all grow old like a garment; Like a cloak You will change them, And they will be changed. 27 But You [are] the same, And Your years will have no end. - Psalm 102:25-27 NKJV

6 "For I [am] the LORD, I do not change; Therefore you are not consumed, O sons of Jacob. - Malachi 3:6 NKJV

8 Jesus Christ [is] the same yesterday, today, and forever.

- Hebrews 13:8 NKJV

II. What about passages that seem to indicate God changes?

Millard Erikson in his systematic theology suggests three ways to understand these passages:

- 1. Some of these passages may be anthropomorphisms They describe God's actions and feelings in human terms.
 - 5 Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man [was] great in the earth, and [that] every intent of the thoughts of his heart [was] only evil continually. 6 And the LORD was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart. Genesis 6:5-6 NKJV
- 2. "What seem like changes of mind may actually be new stages in the working out of God's plan."
 - Ex. Offering of salvation to the Gentiles
- 3. "Some apparent changes of mind are changes of orientation resulting from humans' move into a different relationship with God."

Ex. Nineveh

7 "The instant I speak concerning a nation and concerning a kingdom, to pluck up, to pull down, and to destroy [it], 8 "if that

nation against whom I have spoken turns from its evil, I will relent of the disaster that I thought to bring upon it. 9 "And the instant I speak concerning a nation and concerning a kingdom, to build and to plant [it], 10 "if it does evil in My sight so that it does not obey My voice, then I will relent concerning the good with which I said I would benefit it." - Jeremiah 18:7-11 NKJV

III. In contrast to God being unchanging, we humans are constantly changing.

19 "God [is] not a man, that He should lie, Nor a son of man, that He should repent. Has He said, and will He not do? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?" - Numbers 23:19 NKJV

IV. Does it matter that God is unchanging? God's unchanging nature is why we can trust Him.

17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning. - James 1:17 NKJV

God's unchanging nature means we can always approach Him.

We need to recognize and confess our desire for God to change.

God's unchanging nature should lead us to worship Him
