June 4th Planning Pot Luck Meeting

There were 40 people present.

<u>George Barth</u> started the meeting by mentioning the 40 days of prayer that we finished today. He suggested that we keep the pamphlet and read it multiple times.

<u>George Barth</u> mentioned the meeting that he attended that he received the 3 Circle book. He recommended that the church should adopt one evangelistic tool to use. This way we could practice among each other and be able to support each other.

David Edwards asked what was an evangelistic tool?

<u>Mark Sihlanick</u> said he would like to see the church get together and just socialize. Talk about things of interest. eg. traveling, trips, grandkids, knee replacements.

Ken Carlton said he would like to see every committee report at a business meeting once a year on what the committee was doing. <u>Deloris Figg</u> added that we could do the same with the community.

<u>Shirley Edwards</u> said she would like to see the church members take an interest in every church service. Sunday School, 11am Worship, Evening Bible Study, and Wednesday Prayer Meeting.

<u>Mark Simpson</u> said he would like the church to do an adult version of Chill at Chestnut. A get together to play games or some activity and just talk.

<u>Mark Sihlanick</u> mentioned that we are missing an opportunity when the college students come to town to start the new school year. We should use the Fort Ave. sign to welcome the students and invite them to church.

<u>George Barth</u> reported that at a church he visited there was someone to open the door and a second person to hand out bulletins.

<u>Susan Sihlanick</u> reported that at a church they visited there was a board with all members name tags. The members would wear the name tags; then everyone (visitors) would know who they were.

<u>George Barth</u> said that young people are not interested in the denomination a church was. In fact the name Southern Baptist holds negative impression on this generation. He suggested that we rename the church. When people see a change they take notice and want to see what is different.

<u>Mark Sihlanick</u> said that making a change was okay; but before we make any changes – let us be sure there is a reason to make that change. <u>Jean Gilliam</u> said if we do make changes then the whole church needs to back it up and support the change.

<u>Harry Thacker</u> reported that there was a church 50 miles from nowhere. They built a large building and are now drawing large crowds.

<u>Mark Sihlanick</u> said we missed an opportunity not opening the church up during COVID for free use of WIFI.

Connie Gowell said that she didn't know what the church offered. eg. What Sunday School Classes there are for children.

Debbie Montgomery said we need to do something to draw children and families into the church.

Debbie Montgomery said we need to think like an inner city church. Using the playground and basketball court as example. <u>Ken Carlton</u> reported that the Basketball backboard and rim were vandalized and was damaged so were taken down. That the homeschoolers would like to have it replaced by the new school year. <u>Connie Gowell</u> asked if our insurance would cover if someone was hurt on the playground. She was answered that we have comprehensive insurance and would cover an accident if it occurred.

<u>Jean Gilliam</u> said she would like to see the nursery full again. She remembers the time when we had to bring chairs into the sanctuary because the pews were full. She said that maybe we need to advertise special sermon topics or series subjects and to flood Facebook. She said we need to promote the church and ask people to come to church with you.

<u>Mark Sihlanick</u> said that instead of having the sign read: "Tabitha a Disciple of Christ" for Mother's Day. We should have said "welcome mothers and daughters come and visit with us." He also said that Mark Simpson's titles were geared for new believers. Maybe we should use this line of thought on the sign.

<u>Mark Simpson</u> reported he visited Crosspoint. If you were not there by 8am you would not be able to sit in the main sanctuary. He talked to the pastor and he reported that all the church was doing was: Preaching God's Word; Discipleship; word of mouth advertisement, and small groups. He said if you read the 40 days of Prayer you would have found that your relationship with Jesus should be the top priority in your life. That the excitement of Jesus in your life should show and others would be affected by this. This excitement would be contagious and would draw others to the church. A question we should ask ourselves is "Why do we want the church to grow?" The purpose of the church is to spread God's Word and not to grow in numbers.

<u>Carla Barth</u> asked she had to ask herself why should she get up, get dressed up and come to hurch when she could watch it on TV. For her: she missed the music. We need great music to prepare us for the sermon. There has to be joy in the music. She said that when you can go to a Presbyterian Church and have better music that at a Baptist Church then something is wrong. We have a great preacher and we need great music. <u>Jim Pittman</u> said that the style of music a church has tells a lot about who the church is reaching and not reaching. We need to evaluate the type of music we want while looking for a new Minister of Music.

____ we need to find how to answer the question of how to help people in trouble – it

<u>Vye Esposito</u> said that her friend (Courtney Middleton) has learned more from Ian and her Sunday School Class than she had in the last 7 years at Thomas Road Baptist.

<u>Carla Barth</u> said that we need to stop being the Holy Spirit and let the Holy Spirit make the changes in someone's life. All we need to do is present the gospel. The Holy Spirit will do the rest.

<u>Jean Gilliam</u> reported that when Jerry was Chairman of the Deacons we had a visitor. The visitor left half way through the service but left a note. The note said: This church is dead!"

<u>Vye Esposito</u> said that she didn't want us to think we aren't doing any good, but we need to do better. We need to find a hook to get visitors into the church.

<u>Carla Barth</u> said it is the joy of worship that lifts you up that continues in you when you leave the church and go out into the world.

<u>George Barth</u> said we need to show an interest in who the person is and not what a person is wearing.

<u>George Barth</u> would like us to have dual membership in the BGAV and in SBCV. That the SBCV has a lot or resources that would be available to us if we joined.

<u>George Barth</u> said we should be in prayer everyday for our church, the leaders of our (God's) church, our pastor(Ian), for the members of our congregation, and for the visitors that come and that will come to our (God's) church

Ian McManamey reported that he was excited at being at Chestnut Hill. That he was excited at what God is doing at Chestnut Hill. God is bringing people into Chestnut Hill. Dr. Jim from LU comes on Wednesday Prayer Meeting. He says he is excited that we still have prayer meetings. That a lot of churches have stopped having them. Ian said that we have many programs going on in the church. We need to take a look and strengthen these programs fill in the holes so that they are more efficient and work better. Some suggestions for new programs are: Grief Ministry and Financial Ministry. We need a better Children's Ministry so that when families with children come to our (God's) church they will want to come back. Thank you for what you are doing. Keep praying for what our (God's) church is doing but also what more we can do.

<u>George Barth</u> said that maybe we need to take a step of faith and have a full time Minister of Youth. <u>Mark Simpson</u> reported that if that happened some of the things he would like to be involved in are the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He would like to gather the young men and women in the community and bring them to the church and sit down and talk about problems they face. Such as child care, struggles that new parents might face, and any topic that they want to bring up.

"Knowing Your Father – God is Faithful"

I. Reviewing the facets of God's attributes.

Knowing Your Father - God is: Infinite Immense Self-Existent Self-Sufficient Unchanging Omniscient Omnipotent Omnipresent

"To have a correct understanding of the attributes it is necessary that we see them all as one. We can think of them separately but they cannot be separated ... Whence, although we attribute to God sight, hearing, taste, smell, touch, sense, reason and intellect, and so forth, according to the divers significations of each word, yet in Him sight is not other than hearing, or tasting, or smelling, or touching, or feeling, or understanding. And so all theology is said to be stablished in a circle, because any one of His attributes is affirmed of another." – Tozer

II. What does it mean to be faithful?

- When someone if faithful, they are reliable, steadfast, true to their word, and able to be trusted.
- God's faithfulness follows from His omniscience, omnipotence, and the fact He does not change.

"Men become unfaithful out of desire, fear, weakness, loss of interest, or because of some strong influence from without. Obviously none of these forces can affect God in any way." – Tozer

III. Scripture Teaches us that God is faithful.
