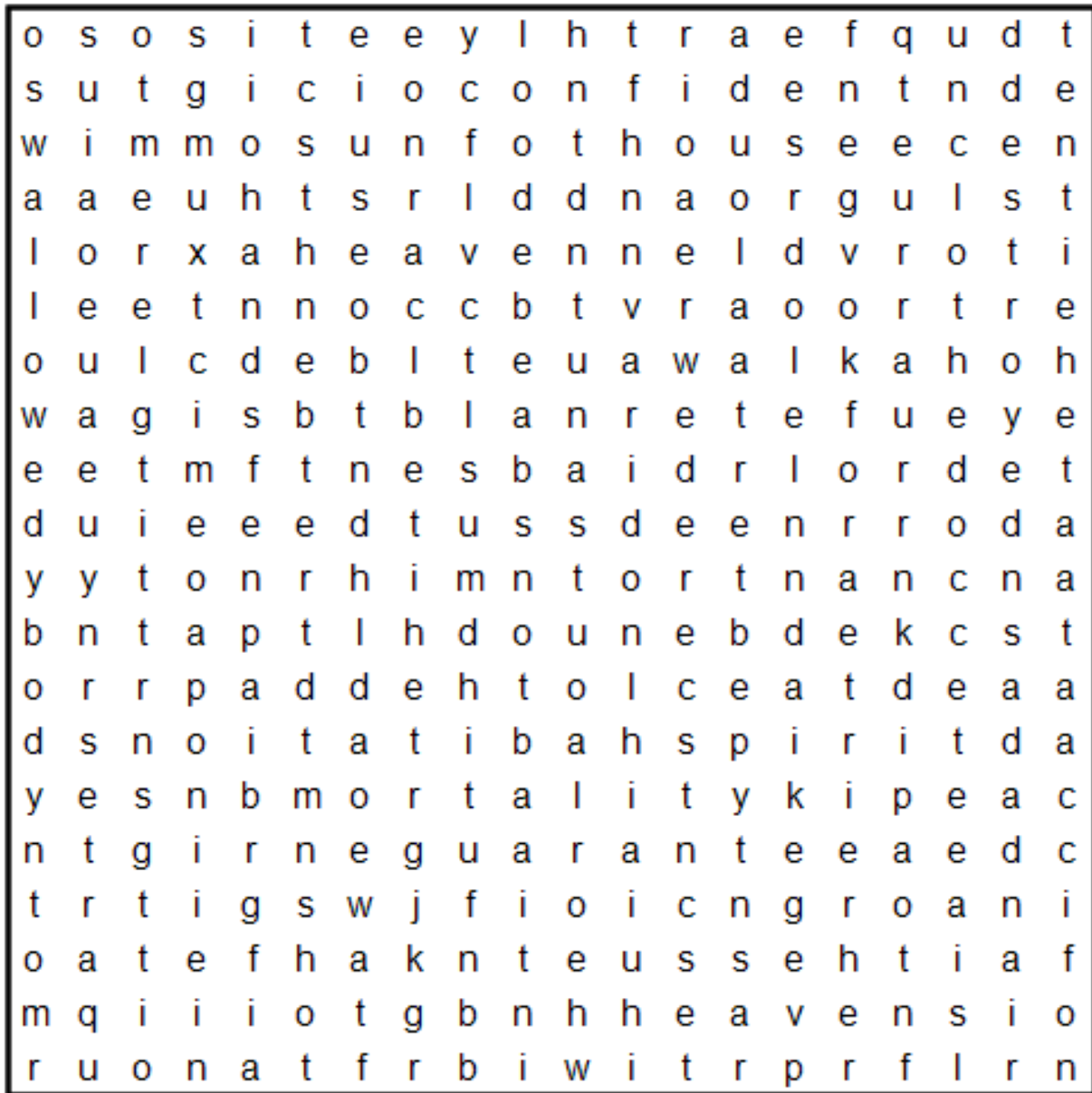

I. We are groaning now. (vv. 1, 2, 4, 6)

II. We can look forward to a future transformation (vv. 1-5, 8)

5 He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee. ... 8 Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord.

III. While we wait, we should live to please God. (vv. 6-7, 9-10)

ADULTS: Tonight we begin our study of Malachi. He is the last of the Minor Prophets in our Bible and the last word from God for over 400 years, when Jesus was born. We will be looking at the first two chapters of Malachi where he confronts Judah about three sins that were grieving God. The Israelites were failing to love God, defiling His sacrifices, and breaking the covenant with their wives. The sins Malachi addresses still occur today, too! Join us, tonight at 6 pm, as we see how God's word, through Malachi, speaks to us today.
