"Knowing Your Father - God is Good"

I. How do we define good?

Good has been defined as: morally excellent, extraordinarily beautiful, deeply glad, or extravagantly bountiful.

For us, "good" is an added quality. For God, "good" is essential to who He is.

"The goodness of God means that God is the final standard of good and that all that God is and does is worthy of approval ... We are not free to decide by ourselves what is worthy of approval and what is not. Ultimately, therefore, God's being and actions are perfectly worthy of His own approval ... good is what God approves ... there is no higher standard of goodness than God's own character and his approval of whatever is consistent with that character." – Wayne Grudem

II. What does Scripture teach us about God's goodness?

18 So Jesus said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one [is] good but One, [that is], God." - Mark 10:18 NKJV

68 You [are] good, and do good; Teach me Your statutes.

- Psalm 119:68 NKJV

God's goodness to all

45 "... He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." - Matthew 5:45 NKJV

[every relationship, job, tree, taste, birdsong, friend, flower, and field is a reminder of His goodness]

God's goodness to those who call to Him

17 [The righteous] cry out, and the LORD hears, And delivers them out of all their troubles. - **Psalm 34:17 NKJV**

10 Those who sat in darkness and in the shadow of death, Bound in affliction and irons-- 11 Because they rebelled against the words of God, And despised the counsel of the Most High, 12 Therefore He

brought down their heart with labor; They fell down, and [there was] none to help. 13 Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, [And] He saved them out of their distresses. 14 He brought them out of darkness and the shadow of death, And broke their chains in pieces. - Psalm 107:10-14 NKJV

17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning. - James 1:17 NKJV


We should imitate God.
